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TRY OUT THE NEWEST PHONE APP TO FIND VETERAN SPECIFIC RESOURCES.

A new smartphone app makes it easier for Veterans to connect with life-saving resources will be released on February 1, 2021.

CVI HELP uses a unique navigation system that allows Veterans to quickly connect with services they need – such as food, shelter, health care, financial/legal aid and employment -- in only two or three touches on their phones.

When a service tab is clicked, organizations' services and contact information are listed, along with Google Maps location marks. The app also features emergency links for Veterans who need immediate help.

All information is available in English and Spanish. The app was developed by the Center for Veterans Issues (CVI). It is being promoted and implemented in collaboration with IMPACT 2-1-1 and the Southeastern Wisconsin Task Force on Veteran Suicide Prevention. It is available in the Apple and Google Play app stores.
